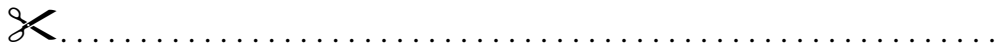

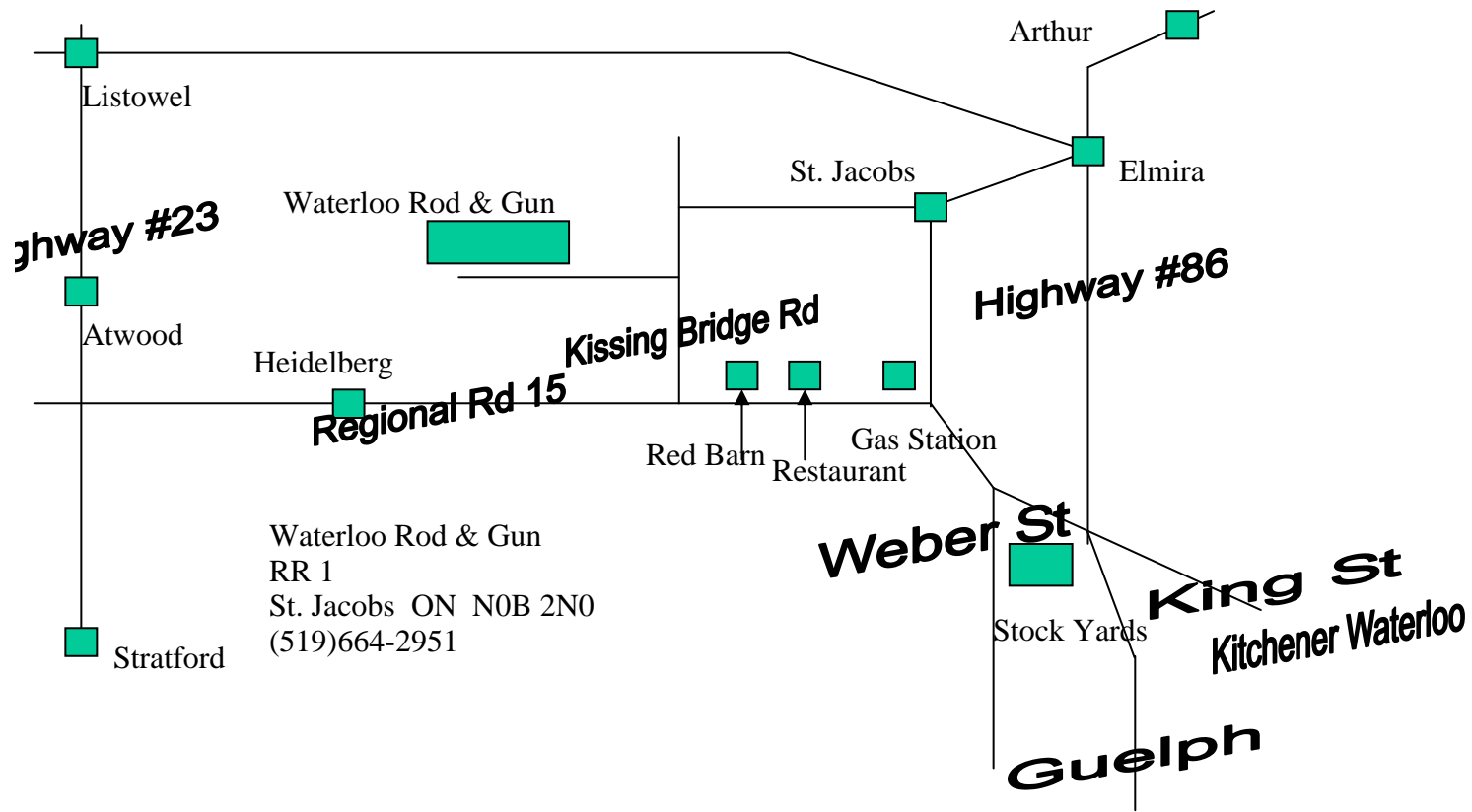

Rules

Calling The Score

by Bonnie Seibold 4th Vice President, NHPA

It is very important to learn the proper way to call the score in a game. This is a big help to the scorekeepers. The proper way is as follows:

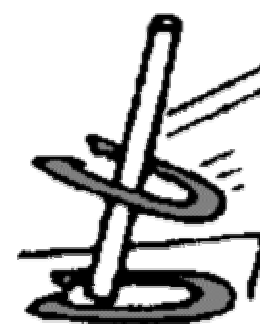
A. The contestant scoring the points shall call the score.

- No ringers with the closest shoe in count – call “ONE POINT”
- No ringers with the two closest shoes in count – call “TWO POINTS”
- One ringer with either no shoe in count or the other contestant having the closest shoe in count – call “ONE RINGER, THREE POINTS”
- One ringer with the closest shoe in count – call “ONE RINGER, FOUR POINTS”
- Two cancelled ringers with the closest shoe in count – call “ONE RINGER EACH, ONE POINT”
- Two cancelled ringers with one uncanceled ringer – call “THREE RINGERS, THREE POINTS”
- Two uncanceled ringers – call “TWO RINGERS, SIX POINTS”

B. No points shall be awarded in the following situations.

The score shall be called by the contestant who pitched second.

- All 4 shoes out of count – call “NO SCORE”
- Two cancelled ringers with no shoes in count or with the other 2 shoes equal distance from the stake – call “ONE RINGER EACH, NO SCORE”
- Four cancelled ringers – call “FOUR DEAD”
