I'd like to share an exciting story in regards to our playoffs here at our Orleans Men's Horsesbox league. We play, 4 man team doubles, consisting of two A Players and two B players, we have twelve teams in our league. In the playoffs, we separate the top six teams and six bottom teams and then we play a double round robin. The playoff winners are determined by the highest points recorded at the end of round robin play: 1 point for a win and 1/2 point for a tie. On our last night of playoffs, (August 31st) something very unusual and exciting happened to end the season. Two of our teams which consisted of Captains Léo Gagnon, (Léo is one of our senior players in the league) and Michel Forget, (Michel is one of our top average players in the league) ended up with the same amount of points. Our league rules are that they must play another game to try and break the tie for 1st and 2nd place. Both the A and B players of those teams took to the court one more time and played another game to break the tie. As the excitement was building on both courts, the B teams finished their game with Michel's team winning the game by a difference of 10 points on the score sheet. On the A players court, something unbelievable happened on the last 4 shoes thrown. David Czyzewski, (Michel's partner) threw a double to place his team ahead by 2 points, then Pierre Gagnon, (Léo's brother and partner) threw his shoes and as unbelievable as it might sound, he knocked both of Dave's shoes out of the pin and placed both of his in for a double. This gave his team a 10 points lead and both teams were again tied with the same amount of total points. At this point our league president (Raymond Lauzon) asked the players of both teams to decide what they wanted to do, with the captains making the final decision. Since both teams has worked so hard to get there and were still so high on this dramatic finish, the two team captains decided that the best possible way to end this was to not play again and have both teams share the honours of first place. At that, it was a





- ◆ A 40 foot team may consist of 2 men, 2 senior men 40 foot pitchers, or 1 man and 1 senior man (40'). If a woman pitches from 40 feet she can enter the 40 foot division with any of the above pitchers.
- ♦ A 30 foot team may consist of 2 women, 2 senior men 30 foot pitchers, 2 juniors or any combination of 30 foot pitchers.
- If we have at least 3 teams entered in the 9 and under 20 foot division we will run a 20 foot division.

# Canadian Hall of Fame Inductee for 2005 Sheila Leis, Kitchener, ONT. By André Leclerc

Born in Pembrooke, Ontario in 1941. Known in our horseshoe circles as Sheila McGrath, she is married to Stan Leis since early 2005. Sheila started playing in the Scarborough horseshoe club in the mid-70s. Mary Archer, Canadian Women's Champion in 1977 inspired Sheila to compete. In her first appearance at the Canadians in 1978, Sheila took 4th place. Sheila won the Ontario Provincial Women's title 7 times including 4 consecutive ones from 1982 to 1985. Her highest average at the Provincials was recorded in 1989 with a 75.7%.

Sheila took part in 23 Canadian Championships from 1978 to 2002 more than any other woman (except Myrna Kissick who also participated 23 times). Sheila won the 1990 Canadian Women's title and the 1997 Canadian Senior Ladies title. Her personal high at the Canadians was 70.2% in 1994.

After being diagnosed with M.S., she qualified twice in the Championship division at the World Tournament, finishing 9th in 1998 (with 66.4%) and 17th in 1999 (with 56.5%). Sheila was the first winner of the prestigious Elmer Hohl Ringer Classic in 1989, averaging 76.2% and edging both Sandy Janssens and Sylvianne Moisan to win that tournament! She also recorded a perfect game of 26 shoes on June 20, 1988 in the Scarborough League) against ...Mary Archer. Although Sheila's days of competition are now over, she can regularly be seen keeping score or helping at tournaments. She has also served as a delegate for Horseshoe Ontario at the Horseshoe Canada Annual General Meeting. Sheila has always been a shining example of sportsmanship, determination, and a true class act.

### Congratulations Sheila from all of us in Horseshoe Ontario.

This is such a thrilling and exciting night for me – to be awarded this honour and especially to be here with all of you.

First I'd like to acknowledge the four candidates who were also considered for this induction which I received tonight. Bernice Busch from British Columbia and Evelyn Moore of Alberta, God bless their souls.

Bernice was a top competitor and champion whom I had the pleasure of competing against in several Canadian Championships.

Evelyn Moore, who I recall – clobbered me with an 85% game in St. John, New Brunswick in 1997. I believe her age was 85 at that time too!

Marg Johns of Alberta and Eileen K. of Saskatchewan. I competed in many championship tournaments against both of these ladies.

All four of these candidates were avid competitors as well as wonderful people and certainly as asset to our sport. I know that one day they will also receive this great honour of induction into the Horseshoe Canada Hall of Fame.

I'd like to thank my nominator, Bernie Baetz and to the voting members of the Hall of Fame Committee for making this a memorable night for me. What an elite group to which my name will be added. When I first began pitching horseshoes I was very fortunate to have someone guide and coach me, that was Mary Archer (at the time the Ladies Canadian Champion). My enthusiasm for competition grew and I found that concentration, determination and dedication were the keys to my success.

A little prodding was also helpful. My prod came from a paragraph written by Ed Murray (then editor) of the Horseshoe Canada Yearbook in 1997. He wrote that although I was ranked the top lady pitcher in Canada for two years that I was yet to win a Provincial or Canadian title. That smartened me up and I won the first of four consecutive Provincial titles starting that year.

I've had a most fulfilling horseshoe career but it's many lasting friendships that are the greatest reward I received from this sport.

Jack Adams mentioned that I've experienced adversity in my life – yes, I've had adversity – it hurts and it causes confusion – I know most of us have suffered the loss of loved ones; illness, either our own or family – other trials that we don't fully understand and its at these times we realize the value of family and friends. So at this time I'd like to thank my wonderful husband, Stan, sister-in-law, Lucille; brother-in-law, Walter and my family for their love and encouragement.
